EXPLICIT INSTRUCTION

WELL, LET US TELL YOU, EXPLICITLY...

Explicit:

“**ex**” comes from Latin and means ‘**out of**’, ‘**away**’, and sometimes ‘**without**’. “**plic**” comes down through Latin, originally from the word “**plek**” from an even older language (**along with “ply” and “plex”**). These very old words carry the meaning ‘**plait**’ or ‘**fold**’.

LEARN TO PLAIT!

To make something explicit, then, is to take out the plaits, or show it without folds. The complexity is laid out in simpler-to-understand parts, with no detail hidden. Otherwise, the detail would be implicit (**im=in, plic=plait**) and too complex (**com=with, plex=plait**) for a beginner to grasp or repeat.
